Pines Fire

Wildfires in southern California may have become commonplace, yet the aftermath left in their wake is often overwhelming. Wildfires throughout the western U.S. in recent years have garnered nationwide attention regarding forest health, thinning, prescribed burning and salvage harvesting. However when timberland is the victim of wildfire, the course of action is far from being universally accepted.

The Pines Fire in San Diego County was in many ways a typical southern California event: summer months, high temperatures, low humidity, strong winds. What was not typical was some of the vegetation that burned—privately-owned timber. The vegetation atop Volcan Mountain includes a mixed conifer-oak forest, with conifers of commercial size and quality.

Once the fire was extinguished, the landowners realized something had to be done, but were not certain what that was. Logging seemed out of the question—no loggers or sawmill are in the region.
